Wantage - Kathleen Farrell, age 65, passed away on Tuesday, November 27, 2018 with her two sisters by her side. Born in Kearny to the late John P. and Isabell M. (Campbell) Farrell, Kathleen lived in the Sussex County and Port Jervis, New York areas for most of her life. She graduated from Glassboro State College, majoring in Early Childhood Education. Kathleen was a kindergarten teacher for the Clifton E. Lawrence School for the Sussex-Wantage School District for 35 years, retiring in 2010.

She had a deep love for reading and loved books. Kathleen was very involved with the Friends of the Sussex-Wantage Library, a member of the local teacher's book club, and was very active in the Sussex County Farm and Horse Show, where she served as the Director of Parking and Passes. Kathleen thoroughly enjoyed the time she spent at the Fair and felt as if everyone were her second family.

She is survived by her two sisters, Maureen Farrell Wisnewski and her husband Steve of Marietta, Georgia and Eileen Clontz of Absecon; her nephews, Steven and Alex; and her niece, Katie.
