Hardyston -Donald O. Bolander, age 92, passed away on Thursday, July 1, 2010 in Newton. Born in Boulder, Colorado and raised in Denver, Mr. Bolander lived in Danbury, Connecticut and Mahwah, New Jersey before moving to Sussex County. He had served in the United States Navy as Captain on the Design, a mine sweeper that was assigned in Okinawa and the Philippines during World War II. Mr. Bolander is a graduate of Northwestern University, the University of Chicago, and had earned a Doctorate of Letters. He had worked for Americana and founded Career Institute in Libertyville, Illinois, a Satellite Company of Grolier Publications. He coined the phrase, "Is your English holding you back?" Mr. Bolander has written several English Grammar Books for many foreign countries. He was also known for his critique of educational books. Mr. Bolander was a Regional Representative and 20 year member of PLT, an International Honor Society and Professional Association in Education. He is survived by his wife of 38 years, Alyce; his two step-sons, Mark and Scott both of Sussex County; his brother, Carl of Bozeman, Montana.
