It was only last week that I thought out your son, Jason, again as I often do: while running. I was huffing and puffing away, far adrift from my former shape of speed and I looked up between tracks through my earphones to notice a person walking in the same direction I was running. Suddenly, Jason's voice bellowed in my head, "Scott, if you don't pass that guy by the next time I see you, I'm taking your jersey!" This happens often, more times than I'd care to admit to people, as well as his voice constantly telling me that head is not in line and that I need to just give it that much more. Jason was a mentor to me, someone that I didn't expect nor deserve as a teammate during my tenure at High Point. He was honest, hard-working, hard-pushing, and above all respectful of everyone on the team. Jason would make you ache in agony, but never agonize on being outside of his good graces. He really was the best team leader I've ever had the pleasure of standing alongside, as well as someone I considered a friend in the sometimes unfriendly environment that is High School. He also made me realize how to lead when it was my turn, but I never stopped learning from him. He would also talk to me before, during (ESPECIALLY during), and after every race; giving me insights that I can only realize now their importance. It went well beyond shaving a few seconds off my time or knowing an opponent's weakness and how to play into it, it really helped me to understand that my perception of myself and how I saw my sport (and in turn, my life) were the only factors I needed to care about, the rest was all details or would come in time. Both Jason and Steve were exceptional teammates and friends, and were always one of the two people that I never lost confidence in their abilities, respect for themselves or others, or kindness in spirit. If someone was to tell me the losses that both of our families have lost in these 8 years since my graduation, I would not have imagined any of them possible, especially for two families I saw similarities in their kindness and cohesiveness. It truly is unfair the trials and tribulations we've had to endure, but I do believe there is only one thing that will keep us sane and together: The memories of

*our beloved ones and the knowing that we all will be together eternally inside of them and after we rejoin them.*

*My deepest thoughts and prayers will be with you, and I can promise that the image of your two boys will never tarnish or degrade in how they affected who I am today. Jason and Steve were examples of not only great people I had the pleasure to know, but a great examples of the parents who nourished them throughout their years.
