Ellenville, New York - John W. Hunt, age 88, passed away on Friday, January 24, 2014, at Orange Regional Medical Center in Middletown, New York. Born on November 11, 1925 in Sussex, New Jersey to the late Judge Marshal and Margaret (Rude) Hunt, he had enlisted in the Merchant Marines and then the United States Army in 1945, serving during World War II. Mr. Hunt had resided in Middletown, New York and moved to Florida in 1987, prior to moving to Ellenville in 1999. He was a retired electrician with the IBEW Local 363 in New City, New York. Mr. Hunt was a member of the Circleville Fire Department and Fire Police, the Middletown Elks Lodge, and the V.F.W. in Ellenville.
