Vernon - Leonard Paul Maggio, age 58, passed away on Tuesday, March 2, 2010 at Overlook Hospital in Summit. Born in New York, New York to the late Vincent and Carmela Maggio, he had graduated from Butler High School and had lived in Bloomingdale before moving to Sussex County in 1974. Leonard was a Mason by trade, who owned and operated his own business, Len Maggio, Inc. until 1997 and recently had been working for his son's company, Joe Maggio Properties in Wantage. He was a member of St. Jude The Apostle Church in Hamburg, a former member and past chief (1982) of the Pochuck Valley Volunteer Fire Department, a member of the New Jersey Fireman's Association, a member of the Drifter's Car Club of Sussex County, and was instrumental in the organization of constructing the Vernon P.A.L. Building and donated much of his time towards erecting the structure. Leonard was predeceased by three brothers, Vincent Maggio, Ernest Maggio, and John Maggio and his sister, Concetta Maggio Shimanski.
