I'm sorry she lived so long without your father! From 1989 to 2017. That's so many years. But she had all of you and the grandchildren and I know, from my own experience as a grandparent, how deep that joy goes. It did seem like she would go on forever, smoking her cigarettes, laughing, looking beautiful. But it happens to the best of us, doesn't it? We have so many wonderful memories and also sad ones, and it's all we can hope for.

So I'm sending you love and my deepest condolences. May your memories of her sustain you.
