Montague - Ralph "Butch" Storer, age 76, passed away on Wednesday, September 23, 2020 at the Karen Ann Quinlan Home for Hospice in Fredon. Born in Eatontown to the late Leo and Hazel (Erven) Storer, Butch was raised in Freehold and moved to Sussex County in 1962. He had served in the United States Marine Corps. during the Vietnam Era and received a Purple Heart. As a teenager, Butch started to work at Wild West City in Byram, where he drove the stagecoach for over 50 years. He had been employed as a pipefitter for W.J. Malone and Associates in Totowa for 43 years and retired in 2013.
