Wantage - Raymond Cullen, age 76, passed away on Tuesday, May 12, 2015 at Newton Memorial Hospital. Born in Brooklyn, New York to the late Raymond Cullen and Loretta Mastropolo, he was raised in the Forest Hills section of Queens, New York and graduated from Passaic Valley High School in 1957. Mr. Cullen served in the United States Army as a MP during the Vietnam War. He moved to Wantage 42 years ago. Mr. Cullen was a service engineer for Pitney Bowes in Elmwood Park for 34 years and had retired at age 58. He was a member of St. Monica R.C. Church in Sussex, the NRA, was a coach for the Sussex-Wantage Little League for 7 years, and enjoyed target shooting. He especially enjoyed spending time with his grandchildren and attending their various sporting events, dance recitals and horse back riding.
